

# Santa Bell Ornament

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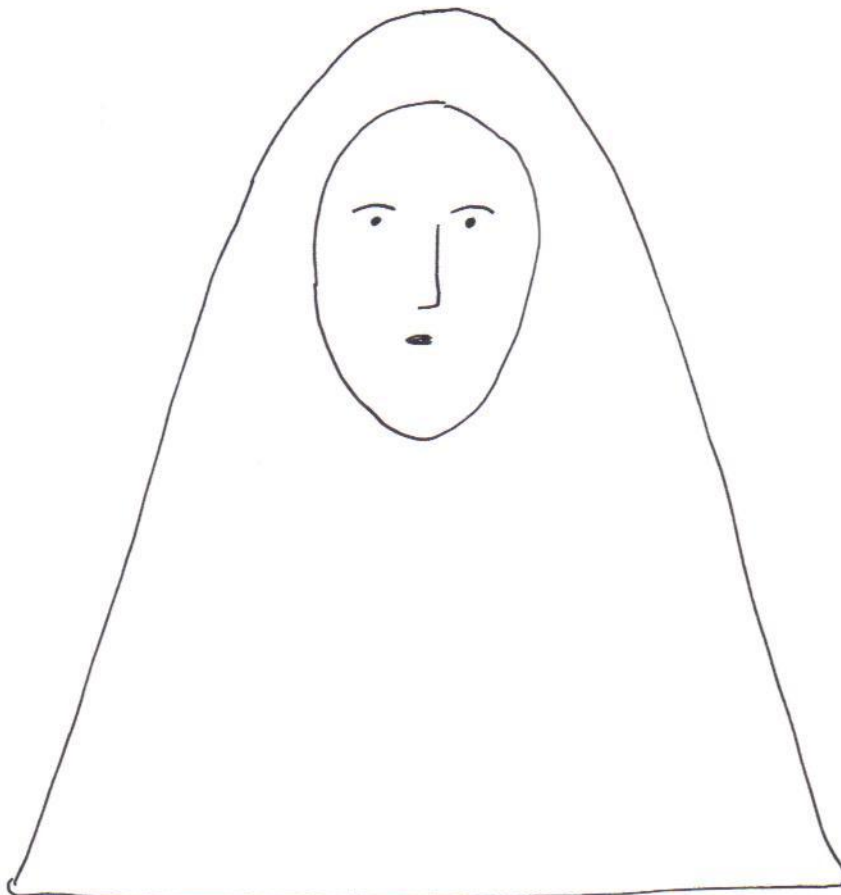
The Woolen Willow

Trace the bell shape onto one piece of wool with a chalk pencil, or chalk wheel. Also a sliver of soap works! Before cutting, layer the two pieces of wool together and sew on the drawn line all the way around. Cut away excess leaving about  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Make a small slit where the face wool will cover it up later, and turn the bell inside out and stuff. Cut out the face wool, and make French knots for eyes with blue floss, backstitch the nose with light brown floss, the eyebrows with cream floss, and the mouth with red floss. Whipstitch the face onto the bell covering the slit.



Using small amounts of roving at a time, needle felt around the face, below the nose, and nice and thick for the beard. Next, cut a piece of pipe cleaner and stitch it around the face as if it were the brim of the hood. Stitch the bell to the bottom center and make a loop of floss at the tip of the bell to hang! Make a bunch and fill a tree, or use a decoration on presents!!! The scrap bin is a great place to find good small pieces to make more!!!
